Giving. Total general fund giving needed each week for projected budget is \$2,955. Last week's giving to general fund was \$3,384.

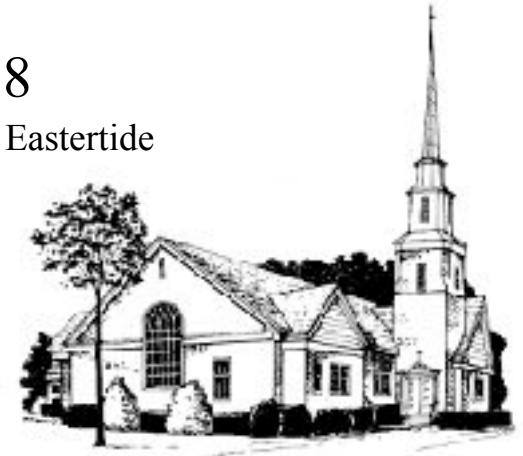
